Some of your breeds are unfamiliar to us in Britain, and this made for a very interesting experience, when judging my first priority is to be some that any exhibit is capable of still doing the work it was originally bred for, is not just a beautiful coat! Intelligence, good construction and form muscle must all be combined this combi-

nation brought some exhibits which were carrying all of these very essential points.

When you have a good specimen, it must also relate to its handler, so they will work together to make for food exhibition. At the end of the day there were some good lines of unbeaten exhibits from which I would make the final decisions and the wonderful Best of Breeds made it for from easy. To reduce down to first four was hard work! The decision between 1+2 was so difficult. I felt that the Australian Shepherd carried a little more overall maturity and body, so went over the Russian Black

Terrier whose type balance and movement were excellent. The Pyrenærian Sheepdog has been in Britain for some time now, but is only this year that they have had their own separate classes. This one was in excellent order and so sound. The Schipperke appealed so much, I was interested to see in the catalogue is of UK blood lines. When I returned home to deal with the entries for our Group Champ Show, with memories of a very happy weekend.
